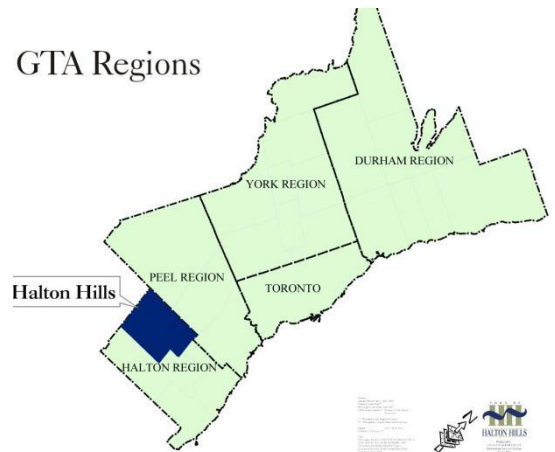
About the Host: Town of Halton Hills

While the Town is located on the outer edge of the rapidly growing Greater Toronto Area (GTA), much of the municipality remains rural in character, with significant portions protected by the provincial Greenbelt Plan as well as the Niagara Escarpment Plan. The Town of Halton Hills, with a population of approximately 60,000, is made up of several interconnected smaller towns, villages and rural settlements with a distinctive and enviable identity that comes from the beauty and tranquility of the rural setting, rolling hills, rivers and valleys. It consists of two urban centers, Georgetown and Acton, the Halton Hills Premier Gateway employment area, three hamlets – Glen Williams, Stewarttown and Norval – and several smaller settlements.

Halton Hills is one of four municipalities that make up the larger Halton Region (Halton Hills, Milton, Oakville, and Burlington). The Town has long been recognized for its natural beauty, active agricultural community, high quality of life and proximity to major centers. Halton Hills is a community where we enjoy safe family living, scenic beauty and active community life. Our community recognizes the attributes that set it apart from other places and is passionate about preserving its small-town character and rural feeling. The preservation and enhancement of these features, while keeping pace with the diverse needs of our community, is at the forefront of our Vision for a sustainable future. The Town is ranked as one of the top small communities in Canada by a national magazine.
